





Dear Parents/Carers,

Y1 Trip to Amberley Museum on Weds 25th February 2026

We have planned our spring term trip to **Amberley Museum and Heritage Centre on Weds 26th February**. We will be leaving at 9.15am and returning by 3.15pm. This will be a great chance for the children to see many of the wheels and vehicles they have been learning about. The Museum contains a wide range of exhibits, from transport-based collections, such as the Southdown bus collection and the village garage. The children will take part in a workshop about travel including rides on one of their onsite buses and the narrow-gauge railway. They will also become “Bike Detectives” looking at a collection of historical bicycles. It will be a fun packed day full of wheels!

The cost of the trip will be **£17.40** for which we invite you to make a contribution of this amount via MCAS. Whilst payments for trips, activities and workshops are voluntary, costing is subject to regular review. As such, please bear in mind that if sufficient funds are not received, in order to cover the cost of these trips, then we may be unable to provide these additional opportunities for your child/ren, going forward. We will, of course, always be ready to help in cases of genuine financial difficulty – please do speak in confidence to the School Finance Assistant.

Children will need:

- Warm trousers/leggings for outdoor weather to be worn with the School jumper
- Suitable outdoor shoes or trainers
- Warm and waterproof coat (in case of rain)
- A water bottle and a small snack e.g. apple/banana for mid-morning
- Packed Lunch with an extra small drink (please supply a packed lunch unless specifically requested via Chartwells) **and ensure there are no products containing peanut butter or nuts of any kind.**
- A small backpack that your child can carry their water and snack.

In the past few years the weather for this trip has been varied and extreme. We have experienced freak heat, very cold weather and heavy rain. It's worth checking the forecast on the actual day to avoid unexpected issues which spoil the day.

In addition to the list above, please consider the following:

In the case of warm/hot weather, please ensure your child is wearing their school polo shirt. This is so they can be identified easily as part of our school group if they remove their jumpers. Apply sunscreen and pack an extra drink.

In the case of wet weather, please send your child in shoes that will keep their feet dry. The site has lots of puddles and trainers quickly become wet and soggy. Wellies are perfect.

In the case of cold weather, please ensure your child is wearing a long sleeve top under a warm jumper/fleece. We spend all day outside and eat our lunch in an unheated barn.

If you would be willing to help us on this trip and you have a DBS through the school, please contact the school office telephone or email.

Inhalers and auto injectors that are normally kept in the classroom will be taken and returned to class on the day. If children require prescribed medicines, these must be accompanied by a medicines form (obtained via the office), in their original packaging (including the label with the prescribed dose and the patient information leaflet). Non-prescribed medication (e.g for travel-sickness) must also be in its original packaging, and accompanied by a completed medicines form (obtained via the office), please notify the class teacher in advance of the trip.
