Dear Year 2 Parents,

Year 2 Visit to Worthing Seafront – Tues 17th June 2025

We are planning a visit to Worthing seafront on Tuesday 17th June as part of our topic for the summer term. This trip will provide an excellent opportunity for the children to compare how Worthing seafront has changed over the years. We will also learn about beach safety.

Your child will need to be dropped off at the pier at 9.15am (what3words: ///just.music.warns to the east of the pier opposite 'The Cow Shed'). <u>Please</u> <u>ensure your child is handed over to a member of staff</u>. We will all be walking back to school after lunch.

Your child will need:

- Casual clothes with a school jumper
- A sensible pair of good walking shoes (please note shoes need to be suitable for walking on the wet sand and around the rock pool as well as walking back to school).
- Sun hat for hot weather (ensure your child has sun cream applied before arriving at school) and a waterproof jacket in case of rain
- A small backpack that your child can carry:
 - A small snack e.g. apple/banana for mid-morning
 - A water bottle
 - Packed lunch and non-fizzy drink (no glass please). Please ensure there are no products containing peanut butter or nuts of any kind. All wrapped in a paper bag/soft lunch bag (+ no lunch boxes please). As children will be taken straight to the seafront by parents, we are asking all parents to provide a packed lunch on this occasion for practical reasons. Lunches are being cancelled with Chartwells for this day.

As the trip is a local one without any cost involved this is covered by the generic consent given when your child joined the school. We do ask, however, that you confirm via ParentPay that you have read this letter and agree to take responsibility for getting your child to the seafront on this day.

Inhalers and auto injectors that are normally kept in the classroom will be taken and returned to class on the day. If children require prescribed medicines, these must be accompanied by a medicines form (obtained via the office), in their original packaging (including the label with the prescribed dose and the patient information leaflet). Non-prescribed medication must also be in its original packaging, and accompanied by a completed medicines form (obtained via the office).

Please be aware that children will be touching items on the beach e.g. seaweed, stones and driftwood. Any concerns please see your class teacher.

It would be impossible to run our trips without your help, and once again we would be very grateful for any extra adult help. If you are able to help and you hold a Broadwater school DBS certificate, please inform the office of your availability.
