1. Why do we use the Interactive Learning Diary?

- It provides a convenient and easy way to build our home school relationship and provide an insight to some of the childrens experiences.
- It assists with the capture of evidence, analysis and evaluation of progress spanning a child's learning journey in Early Years.

Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) including Characteristics of Effective Learning (CoEL)



Parent portal really opens and improves the channels of communication between teachers, children and parents. Due to the ease of use, the portal encourages parental participation in their child's development which greatly assists and enhances the parent partnership relationship.

It provides Parents with an opportunity to be more actively involved in their child's learning journey and they can view and make a contribution to these from home.

Q. How do I access the parent portal?

A. Either by the following address:

Q. How do I sign in and view my child's online portfolio?

A. Visit the ILD portal sign in page, either directly at <u>https://portal.interactivelearningdiary.co.uk</u> or via the ILD website.

Each parent user will have their own dedicated ILD account. If required, Grandparents could have their own account too.

A. As your account has your email address registered against it you can reset your password by clicking 'Forgotten Password' on the sign on page



Q. What do I do if it says my account is locked?

A. For security reasons if you enter the incorrect password too many times your account will lock. If you receive this message then please speak to your school or nursery, who will be able to unlock your account for you.



Q. What will I see when I sign in?

A. When signed in you will see your portal home page. This will show a photo of your child or children and allow you to click through and view their portfolio(s). How many menu options you see will depend on the options given to you by your school or nursery.






Q. What will I see when I sign in? (Continued)

A. You will be able to view your child's online portfolio and see what they have been doing at school or nursery with the ability to LIKE and Comment on what you see.


This will include comments, photographs along with any video and audio clips.





Q. Can I contribute to my child's portfolio from home?

A. Yes, you can contribute by uploading a photo and writing a comment on the web portal or using our dedicated parent mobile apps. This may be your child baking in the kitchen or pedalling their bicycle for the first time.






Q. Can I download an app for my phone or tablet?

- A. Yes, we have a dedicated mobile app for parents on Android, Apple and Windows mobile platforms. Simply visit your app store and search for 'ild parent'.
- B. The app allows you to view your child's activity in school or nursery, receive notifications and LIKE and/or comment about the observations you view.


Q. Is my child's data secure?

A. At the ILD we take the security of the data we store very seriously along with your school or nursery.

We take a number of steps to protect this data:

1. All users have their own dedicated username and password

2. We use the padlock and HTTPS in your browser address bar to encrypt data sent to and from the ILD







Q. Is my child's data secure? (Continued)

- **3**. All data is stored here in the UK on our dedicated ILD servers
- **4**. Access to this data is restricted to those ILD individuals who support the schools, nurseries and parents
- 5. All ILD staff members have had CRB (Criminal Records Bureau England) & PVG (Protecting Vulnerable Groups- Scotland) checks at the highest level

We also look for characteristics of how the children are as learners...

Playing and Exploring Finding out and exploring. Playing with what they know. Being willing to 'have a go'. Active Learning Being involved and concentrating. Enjoying achieving what they set out to do. Keeping on trying. Creating and Thinking Critically Having their own ideas. Making links. Choosing ways to do things.

Zac played with his sister. He told her to pretend she had broken her arm and he put it into a sling, using a jumper. Scarlet played basketball with daddy. She tried really hard to get it into the basket. She kept practising until she did! Alfie was making playdough worms. He lined them all up and told me 'this one is the shortest and this is the longest'.
