




Aims Of Tonight's Meeting

- To help your child make the best possible start to school.
- To help you to understand the curriculum that your child will be covering in the reception class.
- To understand how we teach in order to cover the requirements of the curriculum.
- To identify the key ways in which you can help your child at home and in school.

What is the Early years foundation stage?

The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) is the stage of education for children from birth to the end of the Reception year.

It is based on the recognition that children learn best through play and active learning.

Three Prime Areas Of Learning And Development

- Personal, Social and Emotional Development
- Communication and Language
- Physical Development



Four specific areas of learning and development

- Literacy
- Mathematics
- Understanding the World
- Expressive Arts and Design



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A Typical Day In Reception...





Come in to the classroom independently, self register, zones of regulation, hang my coat up on my peg and choose an activity I would like to do.

Stop and listen when I hear the signal.



The teacher asks me to come to the carpet, throughout the day, where we learn together. Then there is a balance of learning through play and adult focused tasks both inside and outside.



The first few weeks Statutory Baseline Assessment

What do your children already know and can do ?

What can't the children can't do yet!

We use this information to help us develop an individual learning programme for each child in order to move their learning forward

Spending time on quality interactions!

6 weeks on... you will be invited in for a parent teacher evening to discuss how they have settled.

Free Flow and Snack time

We are a nut free school!

No peanut butter, cereal bars with peanuts, chocolate with nuts including chocolate spread made from nuts etc.

Only fruit and vegetables are allowed for snack. We also ask that you send in a named bottle of water no juice please.

- Put on own Coats, dress themselves.
- Toilet themselves
- Feed themselves using a knife and fork
- Interact well with others, sharing and taking turns.
- Understand the difference between right and wrong.
- Count, up and down the stairs, at the beach etc.
- Read lots of stories and poems, always.
- Enjoy the summer on the beach/ in the woods/ garden etc, make memories.

Individual Learning packs available to purchase in September to help support learning at home. They will be added to your parent pay account and once payment has been received they will be sent home once the children have settled.
