Governors' Statement of Behaviour Principles

1 Shared Values and Beliefs about Behaviour

As a Christian school we base our ethos on the teaching of Jesus who gave us a guiding principle “love one another”. We therefore see it as a priority that everyone in the school community, children and adults alike, should show concern and respect for one another.

2 Principles

- School agreed routines encourage good behaviour
- Good behaviour can be encouraged and undesirable behaviour discouraged
- Extreme undesirable behaviour will not be tolerated by the adults in the school
- The school will work together with the home to promote good behaviour
- All staff at some time will experience children whose behaviour is undesirable and deserve support and encouragement.

3 Good behaviour will be encouraged and undesirable behaviour discouraged

The school community adopt a set of agreed rules aimed at making our school a safe environment, which encourages self-respect and the opportunity to learn.

As a school we will all use the following agreed rules to encourage good behaviour.

- Follow the instructions of staff and leaders.
- Respect others and respond in the best way (Bullying is never acceptable).
- Be responsible, helpful and ask before borrowing.
- Play carefully and kindly in the right way and include everyone. (No play fighting or hurting others.)
- Join in to every lesson with every teacher.

Undesirable behaviour is behaviour that does not follow our school rules.
